LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

Listed in this booklet are scholarships given by local organizations. All the local scholarships require the use of the common application form. Boonville High School acts as the facilitator for the process. The school distributes scholarship booklets, collects applications and forwards applications to the various scholarship committees. The school does not select the recipients of the scholarships.

In order to participate in the BHS application process, students must attend Boonville High School. After reading through the scholarship booklet, students should indicate on the summary sheet form the scholarships for which they qualify. After receiving a student's application, the Counseling Center will make that information available to the indicated scholarship committees. Applications should be completed and submitted during the student's CA IV or College Prep English class hour on Friday, February 3, 2023. Students not enrolled in Communication Arts should submit applications to the Counseling Center by the end of 1st hour on Friday, February 3, 2023. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. (If you are absent from school on the deadline day you are still responsible for having your application submitted.) A student must meet all of the scholarship qualifications in order to apply for a particular scholarship. Some committees will also require an interview; some require letters of recommendation or additional essays. If a scholarship committee requires a letter of recommendation, that letter must be submitted with the application. If a committee requires an additional application, that application must be obtained from the Counseling Center and submitted with the other applications. Information which is additional to the common application form is the student's responsibility.

Procedure for Local Scholarship Application

The Local Scholarship Application is located in the "Class of 2023" Google classroom (classroom code is **tcec6nm**). The application is completed online, and printed out at school. Photocopies for scholarship committees will also be made at school.

- 1. Read through all scholarships listed in this booklet. Pay close attention to qualifications such as GPA, college major etc. Highlight all scholarships for which you meet the criteria. Please do not apply for a scholarship if you do not meet ALL criteria.
- 2. After highlighting the scholarships for which you qualify, refer to the Summary Sheet on page 15 of the booklet and put an "X" beside the name of the scholarship for which you will apply. This form will be turned in with your application and notifies the Counseling Center of your scholarship selection. Your application will then be distributed to the correct committee for selection. Count the number of scholarships for which you are applying and write that number in the blank at the bottom of the summary sheet.
- 3. This will be the number of copies of your application/essay that you will make. Staple the Summary Sheet to your original application and essay. Paperclip photocopied applications to

- the back of this summary sheet. Any letters of recommendation or additional applications must accompany this form.
- 4. Application should be typed and proofread carefully. Please make sure all sections are accurate and complete. Any typo or error could disqualify your application. Please use your 7th semester GPA and highest ACT score. You will receive a copy of your 7th semester transcript after Christmas Break so you will know your GPA and ACT scores.
- 5. Essay—if you are enrolled in College Prep English or CA IV you will work on the essay during class in January. If you are NOT enrolled in these classes please see the school counselor for assistance. Essay should only be one page (300 words) in length. **PROOFREAD!**
- 6. Copy the two page application/essay onto one sheet of paper –front to back. Make the same number of copies as indicated at the bottom of your summary sheet. **Be sure to sign and date the bottom of each application** (do not photocopy signature). Please staple the original application/essay to the summary sheet. This will be kept in the Counseling Center.
- 7. If you are applying for a scholarship that requires letters of recommendation or other documents, attach those to the local scholarship application.
- 8. Write the name of the scholarship (i.e. American Assoc. Of University Women) in the upper right hand corner of the application.
- 9. On **February 3, 2023**, submit your scholarship packet in your College Prep or CA IV class, or to the Counseling Center if you are not enrolled in College Prep English or CA IV.

- Summary Sheet indicating which scholarships for which you are applying with the original completed application/essay stapled to the summary sheet.
- Photocopies of the original application/essay with any additional documents and/or letters of recommendation attached to the application/essay. The number of photocopies should match the number at the bottom of your summary sheet.
